### **Core Tasks:**

- Enforce the law
- Uphold peace at public events.
- Investigate criminal activity by interviewing victims, witnesses and suspects.
- Patrol neighborhoods
- Prevent crime
- Respond to calls

## **ABOUT POLICING:**



Police officers keep people safe and enforce the law. They patrol neighborhoods and respond to calls about crimes and accidents.

- Police officers work in a variety of settings i.e. busy urban areas, quiet neighborhoods.
- Spend time working in police stations, writing reports and keeping records which may contribute to convicting criminals in court.
- The job can be mentally, physically and emotionally stressful but also very rewarding.
