Reminder: Travel Restrictions on St Helens Road come into force from Monday 30th September 2024

As mentioned last week, there will be significant travel disruption on St Helens Road from 30th September 2024. From Bonnywell Road to Leigh Bridge, the road will be one-way in a northbound direction. That means, that the road is close to traffic coming from Leigh towards Lowton. Traffic going towards Leigh from Lowton will still be open. Miss Clare (Deputy Head) created this video that all students were shown in period 4 today, explaining the impact of the one-way road closure in place on St Helens Road from 30th September.
