In previous years, we raised just over £1,700 which converted to over £7,000 in Ugandan buying terms. I hope we can match or even exceed that amount this year.

In order that we can hopefully maximise the gift to the orphanage, we would politely ask that you do not feel compelled to buy any new clothes for this day in school.

As part of the social action strand of our curriculum strategy, we look to help students see a world beyond Lowton, to reflect on what we have and what we may take for granted. In addition, it is a call to respond and act, to help those in challenging situations through no fault of their own. At the heart of our social action focus

as a school is the inspiration we find in the Old Testament book of Micah, which challenges us to 'do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God' (Micah 6:8)
