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Homework

Our new Year 7s have had computing lessons this week to show them how to access their homework. We use a system called Satchel:One for this. They all now have their login details for when homework is issued. All Year 7 students have been issued with details of how their parents can log in to this system too.

Parents in all year groups can access their child's Satchel:One. This is a very useful way to help us ensure your child keeps on top of their homework and completes it on time and to a high standard.

Students have been given a homework timetable.

COVID testing

By the end of Monday, we will have completed our two rounds of testing in school.

As a reminder, if a child tests positive for COVID-19 only that child will be sent home and anyone displaying symptoms. The requirement to ask close contacts of a positive case to isolate for ten days has been removed by the Government, which will mean an end to the significant disruption of last year when large groups of students had to be sent home.

Lateral Flow Testing Kits will be given to students next week.

Starting next week, please remember to do home tests on Wednesday and Sunday evenings and report the outcome to the NHS and the school at <u>testresult@lowtonhs.wigan.sch.uk</u>

Car parking

As a general rule, please do not drive into the school park in the morning or evening to drop off or pick up your child. There is precious little space to allow for this safely at the start of the day.
