Dear Year 11 parents and carers

Year 11 COVID-19 testing arrangements and returning to school

I wrote to you earlier this week about our plans for getting all students back into school from Monday 8 March. We will start bringing all students in all year groups back into school in a staged way over several days.

This will start with the complex task of getting all students tested three times in the first couple of weeks.

Year 11 students will be tested on Monday 8 March and if you have given consent for your child to be tested they will need to be in school that day.

- Students in X Band will need to come in for 8.30 am
- Students in Y Band will need to come in for 10.30 am

Students can find out their teaching band by looking at their classes on Satchel one. For example, 11x1 = Band A and 11y2 = Band B. Forms tutors will ensure that all students know their Band and start time in Form Tutor time next week. If you need assistance identifying your child's Band, please ring school and speak to Mrs McVey on Reception.

Once your child has been tested they will stay in school for the remainder of the day.

If you have **not given consent** they will continue with remote learning until returning to school on **Tuesday 9 March** when all Year 11 need to be in school for 8.30 am.

However, I would strongly encourage you to give consent to ensure the safety of your child, your family and our whole school community in our collective fight against the transmission of the virus.
